Listed below are the terms and conditions which you must agree to before you will be considered as a candidate to adopt a husky from Husky Rescue SA

Terms and Conditions

Thank you for your interest in adopting a “second-chance” husky. Please be advised that we are a non-profit organisation and that we ask for an adoption fee of R850 for an adult & R1000 for a puppy, to cover our veterinary expenses. The adoption fee must be paid before receiving of the husky.

The R1000 adoption fee for a puppy does include sterilisation at the age of six month at one of Husky Rescues preferred Vets.

All dogs are neutered/spayed, fully vaccinated, de-wormed and micro chipped before they are placed in a new home. Due to the vast amount on healthy animals being euthanazed due to a lack of available homes, we do under no circumstances place unsterilised animals.

In a case of emergency, if we do place an unsterilised animal in your care, you do agree to having the animal sterilized at the soonest possible moment at one of Husky Rescues preferred Vets.

An adoption contract between the new owner and Husky Rescue SA will be signed.

As a new owner of a husky, you will be responsible for the following:
Making sure that you’re husky gets the mental & physical stimulation it needs.

Your husky gets medical attention when required within 4 hours.

Your husky is provided with adequate food & water at all times.

We will also be able to give you an indication about the temperament of the various dogs (very active, good with children, relaxed, does not like other male dogs,...) and we hope that this will help you to find the perfect match.

We carry out a home check to make sure that your property is suitable for Siberian huskies. We require at least 1,8m tall walling, a double-gated property or separate front and back garden and some kind of shelter. Huskies are bred to RUN and will slip out of your gate or jump over your fence if given the opportunity. Huskies are also hunters and usually

not good with cats or any other small animals. Huskies are very social dogs and love to be part of a pack - we encourage you to let your husky be a part of your family with indoor access, lots of playtime and on-leash walks.

If you are at work for long hours every day a single husky will be lonely and might exhibit destructive behaviour.

Owning a dog is a big responsibility – you will have to invest money as well as time in your new family member. Annual vaccinations are around R300 , de-worming R100 every 3 months, good quality food R500 per month, tick & flea prevention R100 per month, a kennel, doggie beds, treats,... You will have to spend time with your new pet – walks, playtime, grooming, training, cleaning up the yard... and all of this for the next 10 to 15 years.
